

Next Steps – How to Earn the CISR designation if you choose NOT to complete the TIIA designation.

1. Get credit for the TIIA classes you've already completed.

If you already have earned credit for certain TIIA classes, you could get credit for the equivalent CISR course. Please refer to the charts below.

***Please note, you must have successfully completed all the multi-part classes and their exams for a TIIA topic to get credit for the CISR equivalent.** For instance, in the first example below, you must have successfully completed Business Auto Parts A, B & C and Workers Compensation & Specialty Policies Parts A, B & C to get credit for the CISR Commercial Casualty class.

Please note there are no CISR equivalent credits for the TIIA Agency Operations (AO), Life & Health Essentials (LHE), Elements of Risk Management (ELR) courses.

2. Complete CISR classes to fulfill the remaining credits needed for the designation.

You must complete and pass the corresponding examination of five of nine courses offered in the CISR program.

If you have determined you have earned credit(s) for a CISR equivalent class, you will need to complete as many CISR classes are necessary to fulfill the five-class requirement. For instance, using the chart above, if you completed all six TIIA Personal Auto Exposures classes, you would already have credit for the Insuring Personal Auto Exposures (PA) CISR class. Therefore, you will need to complete only four other CISR classes, instead of five, to earn the designation.

3. Receive Confirmation from The National Alliance.

The National Alliance will send confirmation of your attainment of the CISR designation. Please allow up to two weeks for processing.

4. Maintain the CISR Designation

To maintain the CISR designation, you must complete an annual update requirement.
